### MEET OUR NEW PRESIDENT

#### REFUGIO CANYON TRIP

On May 10, 1964, an ideal birding day, twenty members of our society went to Refugio Canyon. This trip had two beginnings- one group met at the Refugio Beach State Park to go over the Refugio Pass to the Santa Ynez Valley where around noon they met the party that had gone over the San Marcos Pass to the Refugio Road. At the meeting spot we had our lunch and social hour on the side of the tree-lined road. About seventy-five species of birds were observed. The outstanding species seen was the Lewis' woodpecker, plus the white-tailed kite, pygmy owl, black-chinned hummingbirds, one building its nest in a shrub at the Santa Ynez River, western and Cassin's kingbirds, ash-throated fly-catcher, martins, and among the cattails and mule fat bushes in the Santa Ynez River were hundreds of gregarious tri-colored blackbirds and a constant chorus of their nasal notes.

#### ISLAND BOAT TRIP

The May 24th trip to the Islands was a great success. On the trip out the channel was really full of cormorants (three species but mainly double-crested). Eight pairs of Xantus' murrelets were passed at close quarters. The high light of the trip was an American oyster-catcher, which all 29 in the party saw clearly and close up on the north shore of Anacapa Island. According to Small's annotated check list, this bird has been reported in southern California only three times, with no records since 1910. It is the same size and shape as our black cystercatcher, which was quite common. It has the same big red bill but in place of being all black, is bright white on the belly secondaries and upper tail coverts. Thirty-two species were recorded, including a black-legged kittiwake which followed the boat quite a while, many redethroated loons, pigeon guillemots and ravens, three species of cormorants, a peregrine falcon high over Santa Cruz, a a wandering tattler and at least five Sabine's gulls. The visibility was good and the weather fine though the wind and sea came up as usual for the return trip.

#### MT. PINOS TRIP

Sunday morning, June 7, bright sun greeted the vanguard of 27 "eager beavers' assembling at the Museum at 7 o'clock for a delightful all-day trek to Mt. Pinos, some 130 (mostly curvaceous) miles distant. By 7:10 maps had been consulted, birders had been stowed into 7 cars and we were off, over scenic Casitas Pass, Wheeler's Gorge and Pine Mt. Summit. During the brief rendevous below the latter, young naturalist, Chris Neely bagged a "red velvet ant" with Cookie's nimble assistance. After Lake of the Woods and Cuddy Valley, the road begins climbing Mt. Pinos. A bit below the summit, among fragrant pines we birded before lunch. Among the birds noted here and during the day were mountain quail, white-headed woodpecker, mountain chickadee, pygmy nuthatch, Cassin's finch, pine siskin, green-tailed towhee, chipping and song sparrows. Versatile Waldo turned chickadee pro-tem, getting several to answer him quite insistently. Welcome lunch, enjoyed at ease on a pine needle carpet, was enhanced by a delicious chocolate cake made and generously shared with us by Mrs. Stevens. After lunch, we drove up to the top of Mt. Pinos, 8,831 ft. We did not linger long on the wind-swept, invigoratingly cold summit. We did get a glimpse of the Clark's nutcrackers who seem to enjoy the high altitude. There was some discussion as to the name of the pine growing on the summit. On returning to the Museum and consulting books, it was decided that the pine was the limber pine, Pinus flexillis, not Pinus albicaulis, the white bark pine. It was, indeed, a most enjoyable outing!
