MONTHLY PROGRAM: Friday, October 23, 1987

"PAST, PRESENT, AND FUTURE OF CACHUMA LAKE AREA" will be discussed by Neal Taylor, naturalist at the lake.

Mr. Taylor is responsible for fabulous boat tours around the lake - rich in information about the flora, fauna, and history of this special area. (He is also a past National Flycasting Champion!)

Staff at the lake are busy implementing plans to enhance the accessing of what the lake has to offer: new bird trails, fish habitats, a docent program, interpretive center and a museum.

Mr. Taylor reports 278 species of birds sighted around the lake in the winter of 1986-87! Come hear more about it! Program starts at 8:00 p.m., Farrand Hall, Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History.

PRE-PROGRAM WORKSHOP

SANTA BARBARA BIRD REFUGE

As we go to press with this volume of El Tecolote, the City of Santa Barbara Parks Department is in the process of selecting an engineering firm to prepare the final details on the plans for the rehabilitation of the refuge area.

The Parks Department has requested the assistance of SBAS to conduct an on-going census of bird life over the next five years. The original plans called for such a study as a means of monitoring the changes and success of the rehab work.

Erik Rosa was promoted to a better job and will be working different hours congratulations, Erik! But this leaves us with a significant hole in the organization.


The Secretary attends monthly board meetings, prepares minutes and agendas, and sees that they are distributed to all board members prior to each meeting.

BIRDS OF SANTA BARBARA

Avian highlights in Santa Barbara County this past summer included a pair of Northern Parulas on San Jose Creek in Goleta during July and August; no evidence of breeding was found. A Black and White Warbler there during the same period was also quite unusual in summer. A Summer Tanager returned for a third year to the Rocky Nook Park area. A male <u>Great-tailed Grackle</u> was briefly spotted in Goleta, and several <u>Black Skimmers</u> were sighted at the Santa Inez River mouth. Single <u>Horned Grebes</u> and <u>Common</u> <u>Mergansers</u> at Lake Cachuma in late June were unusual for the season. In late August and early September a flurry of activity brought Bell's and Red-eyed Vireos, Canada and Chestnut-sided Warblers, And an incredible-for-the-lowlands White Headed Woodpecker to Carpenteria! Santa Maria area saw a Ruff, Parula, immature Painted Bunting, and Buff-breasted Sand-piper (first locally since 1964). Farther afield, the highlight of the season in $\frac{Ventura\ County}{Email}$ was certainly the female $\frac{Black-backed}{Email}$ Wagtail present for weeks in Port Hueneme. This is the first regional record of this accidental from Asia and Africa!
