SANTA CRUZ ISLAND SCRUB-JAY JAUNT!

ADD ISLAND SCRUB-JAY TO YOUR LIFE LISTS!

Having trouble padding that life list? Seen all local residents and rare transients? Then for a mere \$65, JOIN US ON AUGUST 31st, 1996, for a thrilling marine mammal, seabird and island foray in search of the *Island Scrub jay*, a species whose AOU status is due in part to its non-migratory habit isolating it geographically from other races of scrub-jay. We leave from SEA LANDING on Saturday, August 31st at 8am sharp aboard the *Condor*. Use the coupon below to sign up and reserve your space today!

Itinerary: Leave from Santa Barbara Harbor aboard the Condor under the watchful care of Captain Fred Benko and crew for a day of marine mammal watching and a hike around Prisoner's Harbor and Cañada del Puerto on The Nature Conservancy's Santa Cruz Island Preserve where Island Scrub-jays are common. At mid-afternoon we will board the Condor and return to Santa Barbara by about 5pm. This is a must for seabird, marine mammal, and your first-time Santa Cruz Island trip!

Leaders: Seabirds - David Koeppel and Brad Schram. Marine mammals - Captain Fred Benko and Peter Cantle of TNC.

Clothing: Dress in layers. Island hike can be hot while boat ride may be foggy, windy and cold. Expect sea spray, so bring raincoat and hat. Sun block a must. Shoes must grip wet deck as well as be fit for leisurely two hour hike on rocky stream bed - if you need them to hike, please do not wear boots on board - pack them separately for use on shore.

Seasick?: Remember, take internal remedies an hour before sailing. Carry snacks; ginger concoctions can calm stomachs.

Feasting: Bring a lunch and non-alcoholic drinks, water, or buy all on board the Condor.

Insects: Yellow jackets are common, so remember they like to share your food! Insect repellent, for those who must.

Toilets: The Condor has heads. There are no facilities on shore, so know your poison oak - "leaves of three, let it be!"

Optics: Binoculars a must! Cameras welcome. We'll travel close in to many deep coves. The Painted Cave should be worth several photos - so, don't forget the film, and bring plenty!

How to get there: Follow instructions below, see map. From North: Exit 101 at Castillo Street, right at bottom but immediately enter left lane to go straight through next light; at end of Castillo, turn right onto Cabrillo... From South: ZOO Exit, LEFT lane - left at bottom and follow Cabrillo through waterfront to harbor, passing several stop lights to get there... Take left turn into harbor parking once Castillo has been exited or passed - depending on the direction from which you entered the City.

Back by Popular Demand, Jon Dunn returns with another of his workshops, this one being a "Sparrow Identification Workshop", designed to take stress and mystery out of the "Little Brown Jobbies" (LBJ's). If you've ever puzzled over a fleeting glimpse of little brown birds and wondered what kind of rare - or common? sparrow you just missed, help is on the way!

Nationally known field ornithologist, bird tour leader, and author Jon will show slides and teach us the fine points of sparrow identification. Auduboners remember Jon's successful visit last September when he instructed us on shorebirds. A former resident of Santa Barbara, Jon was the major consultant for National Geographic's "Guide to the Birds of North America". He co-authored (with Kimball Garrett) "The Birds of Southern California", and is compiling data on a soon-to-be-published field guide to warblers of North America. Bring your binoculars to appreciate feathers! Bring your questions, and your sparrow tales to share during after-talk refreshments!
