AUDUBON YES!

udubon YES? Sounds like a high school yell that you might hear at the "Big Game." Well, when the program by that name gets rolling, you just might hear that shout from the high school students involved and their Audubon Society mentors.

You see, Audubon YES! (Youth Environmental Service) is a program to assist junior and senior high school students in finding environmental projects in which to participate, both to satisfy a desire to do something for the Earth and to fulfill a Community Service graduation requirement. Up to 15% of all high school students would like to do volunteer environmental service work, and all are required to do Community Service in order to graduate. Audubon wants to make it easy for them.

Once a month the Audubon YES! committee will publish a newsletter full of information about environmental projects in the community for interested juniors and seniors. Audubon representatives will then visit each school to explain the projects, the student organizations (e.g. science clubs) will decide in which projects they wish to participate, and the sponsoring environmental groups in the community will take over from there. Everyone involved benefits. Students have a great choice of projects, get to try out many different conservation experiences, and easily satisfy their graduation requirements. Environmental organizations find enthusiastic volunteers, acquaint them with their groups, and maybe find a new member or two.

There's more. Your SBAS YES! committee decided that this program was too good to let the students have all to themselves. The same information which goes into the newsletter will be published in local newspapers and aired on *Environmentally Yours*, Wednesdays at 8:30 p.m. and Thursdays at 5:30 p.m. on channel 17 on Cox Cable. You too can be a volunteer!

Now for the good part. There are a few positions left on the Audubon YES! committee for callers, school representatives, and a typist. Time necessary — two to three hours per month. For further information and to sign on call Dave Wass at (805) 682-6962.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Our Education Chair, Elan Sutton is coordinating Audubon Adventures this year for SBAS. She will also be providing ongoing outreach to schools throughout the year. We will contact you in late December to let you know details of the area you will cover.

Before the Count, watch for the following birds, which we often have difficulty in getting: grosbeaks, tanagers, orioles, any non-Anna's hummingbirds, unusual sparrows at feeders such as White-throated or Harris's. Other species we need: any geese, dippers, pygmy-owls, or long-billed curlews. If you see any of the above or know of other interesting birds, please call Joan Lentz at 969-4397 or Karen Bridgers at 964-1316. In fact, we are interested in any species listed as rare or very rare in the "Birds of Santa Barbara County Checklist" by Lehman and Lentz.

Remember, the \$5.00 participation fee will be collected on Count Day, so don't send it in with your registration form.
