

Treasures of the
Santa Barbara Zoo Aviary

Lauri Warner Lead Bird Keeper

Doors open 7:30 p.m./program 8:00 p.m. at the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History, Farrand Hall Free

AN EXPERT, BEHIND-THE-SCENES look at the care, feeding, and study of the diverse collection of rare, tropical and exotic birds at the Zoo. How do you keep birds from such divergent climates healthy? How well are they able to reproduce in captivity? What do they eat? Which are difficult to work with; which are most interesting? You will be surprised. Our speaker, Lori Warner has worked at the Zoo for 3 years as its Lead Bird Keeper. Originally from upstate New York, she attended UCSB, where she received her B.S. in aquatic biology. Like so many talented graduates, she made Santa Barbara her home. After a stint with Island Packers, Warner volunteered at the Zoo for 2 years before hiring on there.

Birds of the Channel Islands: A Treasure in Our Own Backyard lecture by Paul Collins Monday, April 12, 1999, 7:30 PM S.B. Museum of Natural History Bird Habitat Hall, \$3.00 at the door

As part of the Year of the Channel Program cosponsored by SBCC, SBBG, and SBMNH, Paul Collins, Senior Associate Curator of Vertebrate Zoology at the Museum, will present an illustrated slide lecture about the avifauna of the Channel Islands based on data compiled over the past 150 years. This lecture will overview some of the findings that will be presented in an upcoming book, *Birds of the Channel Islands*, coauthored by Lee Jones, to be published this year.

Go south and turn right on Carpinteria Ave. Drive west on Carpinteria Ave to Estero Way (Apple St on AAA map) turn left and drive to gate. From Santa Barbara take 101 south to Carpinteria Ave exit and take Carpinteria Ave to Estero Way (1st right). After a brief tour of the Carpinteria Salt Marsh Preserve Wayne, the Reserve Manager, will show us the new Nature Park of which he was instrumental in creating. Those who wish to car pool meet at the Andree Clarke Bird Refuge parking lot at 12:30 PM.
