

# EYES IN THE SKY: Update By Gabriele Drozdowski

Watch for OWL-O-WEEN in the next issue of El Tecolote: a family night at the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden cosponsored by SBAS and Botanic Garden.

### Since it began in January 2000 EYES IN THE SKY (EITS) gave 56 presentations to approximately 2000 people, including over 1000 K-6th grade students. The majority of presentations took place in elementary schools where teacher enthusiasm is high, and also in public libraries, the Alisal Guest Ranch in Solvang, the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, retirement homes, nature camps, Boy Scout meetings, and public events like Earth Day, The Monarch Butterfly Festival, and Devereux Watershed Awareness Day.

**EITS** also raised over \$8,500 in funds, completed housing and submitted applications for three additional birds: a Red-shouldered Hawk, a Western Screech Owl, and a Barn Owl. If approved, **EITS** will be able to present five of our areas most commonly seen raptor species to children and adults who rarely have the opportunity to see such neighbors up close – fostering greater understanding and true caring for our own region's wild inhabitants and their habitats.

Thanks to all the SBAS members who have so kindly supported this great new program. Thanks also to the EITS volunteer crew: Morgan Ball, Fred Emerson, Kari Goldenhawk, Catherine Graham, Kendy Radasky, Haley Ross, and Christine Steele, and the veterinarians at the Cat & Bird Clinic, Dr. Christine Sellers and Dr. Susan Hoegeman.

# Wednesday, September 27th **Darlene Chirman**, Speaker "Belize: Wildlife, Conservation and the **Belize Audubon Society**"

Belize is a small Central American country on the Caribbean coast. It is the for-mer British Honduras, and independent since 1981. Only slightly larger than Massachusetts, Belize is rich in bird and wildlife. One third of its land is protected, to varying degrees. The Belize Audubon Society advocated for the establishment of National Parks when the country became independent. The government agreed, if the Audubon would manage them! Today the Belize Audubon Society manages eight natural areas for the government.

Darlene Chirman, President of SBAS and a Conservation Biologist, traveled to Belize this summer to participate in a University of California volunteer program called UREP-University Research Expeditions Program. Darlene and her husband, Sam Chirman, spent two weeks assisting a UC Davis graduate student with research on animal seed dispersal of forest trees in the Columbia Forest Reserve in Southern Belize.

Take 101 to the Glen Annie, Storke exit. Take Storke Road south to its end and turn right onto the Slough Road. Go 0.1 miles and turn left onto West Campus Lane. Drive 0.1 miles to the University Children's Center and park between the Center and the horse stables. We will first walk around the slough to the beach. Wear shoes for walking on trails, sand and maybe tar. Bring water if it is warm. Scopes are useful if you don't mind carrying them for the long walk; I'll bring mine. Trip over by 7:30 PM. Please show your appreciation for the people who will clean up this area Saturday morning as part of the Coastal Clean-Up Day by joining us for this sunset bird walk.
